Travel Notes for 2013–2014



Ou may be thinking about Cape Cod Baseball, the beach and cookouts like most people, but the travel committee has spent the spring and summer researching and negotiating contracts for our fly trips. The fly trips have been on the web site for

over a month and below are some basic information on

the overnight trips. We will begin selecting the day trips starting in late August.

In January and February the travel committee began discussing fly trips for 2013–2014 and in May we completed our selections based on best value and signed the contracts. We have some great trips planned for this year.

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FLY TRIPS



Steamboat/Winter Park: A different trip with 2 separate locations: 3 days in Steamboat, 3 days in Winter Park. The idea of a split trip came from your

surveys for those who wanted more variety.



Grindelwald, Switzerland: After a year with no Europe trip the club journeys back to Europe (air prices have come down just enough). We went to

Grindelwald 10 years ago and members loved it.



Vail: Always a favorite with the club members, staying at the Vail International condos, located between Vail Village and Lion's Head.



Mt Bachelor: A new destination for the club in the great Northwest. Bachelor is a huge volcanic mountain with 360° skiing. Since it is on National Forest

Land, it is surrounded by pristine forest and there is no on-mountain lodging. We are staying in Bend, Oregon, a very cool town with multiple shuttles to and from the mountain, 20 minutes away.

OVERNIGHT TRIPS

In July the travel committee heard from club members who wanted to propose overnight trips. To propose a trip, the member must be in good standing and have run a day trip. We had 7 proposals and we selected 6. The flyers are in this news letter and are described briefly here.



January 7–8—Loon/Cannon: A great way to get your season started. A day each at Loon and Cannon, with a stay at the Indian Head which includes

breakfast and dinner, a box lunch for the second day and transportation—all for \$215.00 per person.



January 14–15—Bretton Woods: Mt Washington Hotel: The marquee overnight trip at the elegant Mt Washington hotel with breakfast and

group dinner at the famous Mt. Washington dining room. 2 days skiing at Bretton woods. All for \$285.00 per person



February 10–13—Jay Peak: The club returns to Jay to see the huge improvements they have made over the last few years. A bus trip with 3 days at

Jay; Ski-Stay and Splash at the indoor water park. A choice of the ski-in/ski-out Stateside Hotel (double occupancy) or golf cottage condos for 4 people. On Thursday morning the bus leaves Jay and we ski a 4th day at Burke Mt, getting us 1 hour closer to home. The club went to Burke last year and members enjoyed the mountain. The cost for this trip is \$494.00 per person



February 23–28—Sugarloaf: The signature club trip. 5½ days of skiing, daily perfect turn lessons, slopeside condos for 4 at Snowbrook condos

(possible Birchwood condos at higher price, but limited by the amount Sugarloaf can get us), Wallyball, a welcome social on Monday (our own party at the Shipyard this year) with a \$100 discount for 80+. All for \$395.00 per person



March 8–9—Bretton Woods family weekend: The club has tried for years to run a family trip on the week-end but with high lodging, lift tickets and a

bus it just has not worked. Margaret Oberlander has come up with a great deal as a you-drive 1 or 2 night for families trying to keep the cost low. All the details have not been worked out but we will update soon. Tell your friends with kids about this trip.



March 11–13—Stowe: After 4 years without Stowe we are going back. A 3-day/2-night bus trip staying at the beautiful Stowehof Inn. 2½ days skiing

at Stowe, 2 breakfasts and 1 dinner. The bus will bring folks to Stowe village on Wednesday night. All for \$365.00 per person.

There is a lot of work done by the travel committee and the trip leaders to try to make your trip go smoothly. They are volunteers and have very busy lives. Give them credit and a "thank you" for all they do to make this a great club. I hope to see you on a trip this year.

had a couple other thoughts that I would like to share in this fall newsletter.

Some Reminders On Fly Trips

The club's web site allows us to have a pre-registration sign-up. This is not a guarantee that you will be on the trip but does allow you to see which friends are going and how quickly a trip is filling up. This also allows us to see if we need to try to get more air and hotel/condo spots which is not always possible, but we try.

Concerns with Overnight and Day Trips

The club web site, giving us the ability to sign up almost at the last minute, has caused some difficulties for our club. We had several trips last year that came very close to being cancelled (one day trip was cancelled) due to low sign-ups. The club can not afford to lose our members' money on trips. We work hard to fill them. In the past, for overnight trips, we used an early bird/late fee to try to get members to sign up early.

We are going to do away with the late fee idea this year but because we are bound by the contracts which have cancellation penalties, we will institute a hard sign-up date on each overnight trip. If we don't get the required number of sign-ups we may need to cancel or try to renegotiate with the vendor. If you sign up after the cut-off date, you may be on a wait list. Please try to communicate with the trip leader if you need help.

We need to do the same on day trips as our bus company has manpower and equipment schedules that they need to confirm at least 4 days in advance.

Last Comment

I want to remind members to continue to respond to our surveys through out the year. The travel committee uses these as our basis to select trips and try to get the right airlines, accommodations and associated activities. But, as most of you know, while group travel has many plusses it also has its challenges:

 We book as a group to take advantage of group discounts. Individual requests to modify trip

- itinerary require approval from Travel Chair, and can only be accommodated if there is no detrimental impact to the rest of group trip.
- Rooming is negotiated as double occupancy or in the case of condos 4–6 per condo. A request for a single room will be considered but cannot be guaranteed. If you go as a single it causes someone else to have to pay the extra cost of a single (unintended single).
- Your request for roommates is worked by the trip leader and it is a very difficult balancing act. For example, Vail this year has 2 bedroom/2 bath condos with a queen in one room and 2 twins in the second. We need a couple in one room and 2 singles in the other. Requests for 2 couples per condo do not work. A request for 4 men/women to a condo creates the issue if 2 men or 2 women will share a queen bed or would one accept a rollaway if we can get it? Most condos in the price range our members need do not have the very expensive split king bed option.
- Our trips need to be negotiated and signed 10 months before the trip. That means we have no idea how the snow conditions look or if other airlines can be used. For instance; Southwest does not release its fares until 6 months out, Jet Blue does not travel to most ski area airports etc. We ask our tour operators to book with the most competitive/best-rated airline that will accept a large group and keep an eye for more favorable carriers as the year progresses.
- Airline flight time and layover changes will occur many times before we go and there is nothing we can do about it. Groups are not given high priority by airlines but your trip leader does their absolute best to keep everybody happy.

There is a lot of work involved in running the trips. The trip leaders do everything in their power to help all members as best they can. I hope to see you on a trip this year.


